
The entire program lasts 30~45 minutes. I adjust the presentation to the level of the audience; with younger children I often end by reading a story.


Workshops:

I am also available to do writing and illustrating workshops with smaller groups of children. For more information, go to my website. I am most comfortable speaking to children in grades K-8.


